

The Alstead board of selectmen met in open session on Tuesday September 25, 2018 at 6:00 pm. Chairman Noonan called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. Members present were Tim Noonan, Alan Dustin and Rock Wilson. Tim Noonan moved to go in to nonpublic RSA 91-A:3 at 6:03 pm, Rock Wilson seconded, roll call to enter into nonpublic was done, Tim Noonan-yes, Rock Wilson-yes and Alan Dustin-yes. Alan Dustin moved to exit nonpublic and reconvene public session at 6:34 pm, Rock Wilson seconded, roll call to seal the minutes Rock-no, Tim-no and Alan-no.

6:40 Tim led the pledge of allegiance.

Selectmen signed manifest and purchase orders.

Rock asked Mike Jasmin if he wanted to continue being Health Officer. Mike confirmed that he did. Rock asked about certain issues in town. Mike says its sometimes difficult to get people to do what you want them to do in certain situations. He indicated that he never used any legal money for this job or any money at all. He indicated that because Alstead doesn't have any policies or ordinances in force by the town or Selectmen it makes it harder to enforce policies. He said there are rules but none adopted by the town. Resident Tom Dowling wanted to know what the next step would be for making an ordinance. Mike said he will send something to the Selectmen.

Jodi prepared a breakdown of the transfer station recycling price increase which is as follows:

As of July 1st, 2018, comingle increased \$25.00 ton. Going from \$30.00 to \$55.00. Since then we have taken out the steel and aluminum non-beverage cans and now only send 1&2 plastics. With doing this we are now only shipping once a month instead of every two weeks.

With what we have shipped, and the estimated weights added we will have shipped 6.22 tons of plastics from 7/1/18 to 12/31/18. Total cost will be \$186.60. Dividing that in a third will be an additional cost to Town of Langdon of \$62.20

Our mixed paper was increased \$30.00 ton. With what we have shipped, and estimated weights added we will have shipped 23.55 tons from 7/1/18 to 12/31/18. Total cost will be \$706.50. Dividing that into a third will be an additional increase cost to Town of Langdon of \$235.50

Total increase to Langdon would be \$297.70

We have saved by end of year for taking out cans \$600.00 in trucking.

Rock moved to leave everything as is and not pass on any increase to Langdon, Alan seconded, motion passed unanimously.

Kim Kercewich reviewed his purchase order requests for both clothing gear and fans giving the Selectmen reasoning for these purchases. Selectmen approved and signed both purchase orders.

Tim addressed the email sent by resident Tom Dowling, who was present at the meeting. The email addressed the Pine Cliff Rd situation and ways to make it a better and safer road and one that does not negatively impact Lake Warren. Tim would like to do something about the verbal discontent from the Lake Warren residents and proposed that if Tom would be willing to interview engineers for estimates for engineering services on how much it would be to design a

road to their liking he would be willing to look at that and put it in as a warrant article. Rock did not share this opinion. He said the culverts need replacing and not necessarily need engineering services. Tom indicated that he and others just want the road to be repaired correctly and it's for the Selectmen to decide. All he's asking is for the board to do what needs to be done to fix it. Tom said they want to minimize what is going into the lake and improve the quality of the drive. Rock told him that the town has maintenance of the road only. Resident Glenn Elsesser asked if they should pursue grant money for this. Rock and Tim did not want to. Alan said to proceed as discussed last week in getting core samples and then will go forward from there.

Glenn mentioned that anyone doing culvert installation needs to be certified and asked if Prescott was certified. This will be looked into.

Appointment for Inspector of Elections for Holly Gay was not signed. Tim would rather appoint Joseph Levesque instead.

Tim responded to the email sent by Lisa Therrien about the upcoming Walk to School Day. Lisa had asked if the Selectmen would be there in order to see the critical nature of needing a sidewalk in front of the three houses leading up to the school. The Selectmen are not available for this event and Tim said that this is a state road and any special projects like this need to be done at the state level. Tim had looked into this and provided the office with the information he obtained.

Rock moved to accept the minutes as read, Alan seconded, motion passed unanimously.

Rock moved to adjourn, Alan seconded meeting adjourned at 7:40 pm.
